## WE HAVE LIFT OFF! THE QUEEN'S HALL INCREASES ACCESSIBILITY FOR ALL

New Mobilift allowing wheelchair access to The Queen's Hall stage will be christened at Drake Music Scotland's 20th Anniversary Concert

Thanks to a **generous donation** from one of its members, Professor John Dale, The Queen's Hall has purchased a Mobilift CX wheelchair lift making its stage one of the **most accessible** of any arts venue in Scotland.

The installation coincides perfectly with **Drake Music Scotland's 20th Anniversary Celebrations**, *Centre Stage*, and the launch of their **#LetMeONStage campaign** which fights for equal access to stages for all performers. **Thursa Sanderson**, **Chief Executive of Drake Music Scotland said**, "We need to see more disabled musicians performing and hear their great music. That's why it's so important for stage and backstage access to be considered as well as access for audiences. We're delighted at the forward thinking attitude of this great Edinburgh live music venue!"



The collaboration between The Queen's Hall and Drake Music Scotland goes back to the latter's founding in 1997, with a 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration in 2007 and inclusion in the Resonate series of schools' concerts in partnership with the City of Edinburgh Council.

**Nigel Griffiths, Chair of The Queen's Hall Board said**, "We are delighted to have been able to purchase this lift thanks to valuable support from one of The Queen's Hall's Members. We are already one of Edinburgh's most accessible venues for audience members and this gives equal access to our stage for all performers. The added benefit of the Mobilift's design is that we can easily hire it out to other venues with access issues, supporting Drake's #LetMeONStage campaign in the process."

The Mobilift CX is operated manually so is extremely portable and easy to operate. Users enter and exit the lift via a ramp which can be raised to a height 1.52m. The Queen's Hall will be making it **available to other venues** in the UK for a modest hire fee and transport costs.
